HEAL OUR LAND

Dear Friend:

No doubt you have heard this scripture before: “If my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and heal their land” (2 Chronicles 7:14). A wonderful scripture that promises peace and blessings for a nation. In order to make a truthful interpretation here we need to answer the question: “Who is the ‘my people’ in this verse?” God is referring to the Israelites, his chosen people. This is fact, this is history, this is literally straight out of the Mayflower Compact. Is this the America today? Is this a predominant factor in our society? Absolutely not. But it doesn’t mean that Christians and the church should just throw-up their hands or withdraw from the culture. Christians are called by His name we are His people. It is our place to humble ourselves and pray for our land. Revival across this land is needed, it will happen when the voice of God is heeded by the church!
