THE KING IS COMING

Dear Friend;

I am confident everyone reading this knows this Sunday is Palm Sunday, the beginning of the most important week of Christiandom. 2,000 years ago, Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. The Triumphal Entry is one of the few events in the life of Jesus recorded in all four gospels. Putting all four gospels together we have a complete picture of what it must have been like for Jesus, his disciples, and all the people present on the day of the event.

In ancient Middle Eastern times if a king were riding into a city on a horse he was coming in as a conquering king. If he rode into a city on a donkey, they were coming in peace. Jesus rode into Jerusalem symbolizing a king who brings peace. This is the first of several different symbolic things connected with Palm Sunday. A second symbolic piece of Palm Sunday is the waving of palm branches and laying them on the ground. A carry-over from the Old Testament, it pays homage to a king and symbolizes his coronation. Palm Sunday was Jesus' first coronation and seen locally in Jerusalem. Christ's second coming will be his second and ultimate coronation, seen globally. A third symbolic act on Palm Sunday was the people shouting "hosanna". Hosanna was shouted to a king during his coronation. Hosanna is "Lord save us" in Hebrew. The people gathered to welcome-in king Jesus hoping they were coronating a Jewish king who would restore Israel and finally bring peace. Sadly, a few days later some in the crowd were part of the crowd that shouted: "Crucify him". They did not realize his kingdom was not of this world and the peace he gave was an inner peace that no ruling army could take away.
