#### EASTER: WHY I AM NOT A UNIVERSALIST

This month Christians celebrate the most important holiday of the year: Easter. I know some of you may debate me about equality with Christmas, that's okay, you have the right to be wrong (just kidding). If you see both of them equally important, you have a good case. Also, when I say Christians will be celebrating Easter, I know many non-Christians will as well. Almost everyone loves candy, although I have no idea how candy or the Easter Bunny came to be associated with Easter.

What is a Universalist? A Universalist is someone who believes everyone goes to heaven when they die. It does not matter whether you are a Christian, Buddhist, Jewish faith, Islam, or no religion at all – everyone goes to heaven. Maybe you have heard about or seen a Universalist Church. I know more about Buddhism, Judaism, and Islam than I do about Universalism. One thing I am certain about Universalism – you can have any concept of God you want and you can go to heaven. Also, Jesus was just a great teacher and he did not rise from the dead – it is just a made-up story.

There are perhaps as many Universalists in America as there are Christians. There are perhaps millions who call themselves Christians but in practice and belief they are Universalist. This perspective is a by-product of what is called Post-Modernism; Post-Modernism is Universalism (particularly in religious beliefs). Both world views see heaven as "the mountain top" and there are many religious paths to the top. In many cases to those who want nothing to do with religions see themselves on the mountaintop when they die. I have a very good friend who professes to be a Christian but has the "many paths" religious belief. He often encourages me to watch videos on YouTube of Easter Philosophical teachers. I have watched just two, and that was two too many!

Easter explodes Universalism. Why? Simple: it boils down to one thing – Jesus rose from the dead and while he lived, he repeated these words in several different ways, "I am the way, the truth, and the life, no one gets to the father except through me." That's it, period. Not many paths, one "mountaintop". Not, "Just follow your heart or believe whatever you want – you will go to heaven if you just stay true to your beliefs." The Christian faith rises and falls on the resurrection. Most of you, but maybe not all, believe this. It is crucial; it is critical. This is the hard truth: if grandma or grandpa, mom or dad, sibling or friend did not accept the resurrection as fact and did not establish a personal relationship with Jesus Christ through repentance and demonstrated it in their life, the Bible is clear: he or she did not go to heaven when they died. Like the billboard says on the Northbound side of I-71, "Hell is real." Hell is real and that should make it all the more important for us to share the good news of our resurrected savior, Jesus Christ.
