ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (Not God's Plan)

We often look back over history and define it in terms of major life changing events. I am not talking about wars or weather, plagues, or people. History can be measured in terms of inventions: harnessing fire, the wheel, horse transportation, the automobile, radio television, the computer, and Artificial Intelligence (A.I.). Like all other inventions, A.I. is here to stay. My first reaction to A.I. was great reservation and some fear. WE are very cautious about something we do not understand. My fear has changed to curiosity and a desire to understand and participate in A.I. My early fears envisioned my computer knowing everything about me (I think it already does) and the government tracking my every move (I think they already do). So, to understand a little more about A.I. I turned to my brother Royce who retired from the Defense Department with a Top-Secret Clearance and graduated from the U.S. War College in D.C. First, he told me: "No fear, the government has been using A.I. for decades—it's just now fully coming into the public sector AND no fear – "we" already know about everyone (I think he was kidding)".

A friend has been asking me since August if he can teach me how to use A.I. Until a couple weeks ago I kept putting him off. A week or so ago a computer geek friend of mine showed me he has an A.I. app and showed me what A.I. can do. So, I confess here and now...I have begun to embrace A.I. and hope to be very comfortable using it within 2-3 months. A.I is super, super fast and a LOT different than "Googling" something and is unlimited in what it can do for you and what you can learn from it. When having lunch with my computer geek friend who has the A.I. app I thought I would test A.I. I saw a Jeep Wrangler out in the parking lot, so I told him to have A.I. write a book report for me about a Jeep Wrangler. He said: "No problem", hit the app and within 1 minute a multiple page book report was written.

A.I. and the Bible have two things in common: both have an unlimited possibility that can affect our lives, and both are something you can spend the rest of your life learning. There, of course, are some major differences and one of them is speed. A.I. is driven by speed, the Bible's emphasis is not about how fast we learn. Let me say it more succinctly: God is not concerned about how much we grow in a short period of time but how deep we grow over our lifetime. Artificial Intelligence is man's plan to help get things done fast, God's plan is about getting people to grow deep and that cannot be fast. We view our life from the here and now, God views our life from eternity. We want a sermon, a seminar or an experience that will instantly spiritually mature us. However, real maturity is never the result of a single experience. A great verse to know about God's desire for our spiritual growth is Colossians 2: 6-7. "So then, just a received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in Him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness".

The following words are the position statement on abortion of the Church of the United Brethren In Christ: "We believe that human life is sacred from the moment of conception until natural death. Consequently, abortion cannot be recognized morally and scripturally as a means of birth control. The church recognizes that abortion may be medically necessary in rare and tragic circumstances, taking into account the life of the mother and baby. The church needs to demonstrate sensitivity and care toward those who have had abortions in the past in order to facilitate an atmosphere of grace and healing. (Paragraph 138 UB Discipline). Voting is a tremendous privilege; please pray before voting.
