

WIN PEOPLE TO JESUS

Dear Friend:

Do you want to see your friends and family members in heaven? Do you want to see them living a life of deep peace in the midst of the storms of life? I hope you do. If you want to see them in heaven and experience deep peace now, they need to know Jesus Christ personally. How do you think this will happen? Will they read a billboard as they're driving down the road that says: "Hell Is Real, Accept Jesus Now" (not gonna happen). How likely is it that they will come to know Jesus through Christian radio? Only about 2%. (Non-Christians rarely listen to Christian radio). What is the most likely way that your friend or family member will personally accept Jesus Christ as their Savior? A Christian shares their personal testimony with them and explains how to become a Christian. Why not be that person!

According to various studies, between 60%-70% of people become Christians because a friend or family member shared their faith. Romans 10:14 says: "How then, can they (non-Christians) call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching (telling them)?" The chances are almost 100% that if your friend or family member does not hear someone tell them how to have a personal relationship with God they will die and go to hell, Luke 13:3, "...unless you repent you too will perish (go to hell)".

I get it, family members are the hardest people to share the Gospel with, and some friends may definitely not be very friendly towards hearing your testimony but the truth of the matter is: they are more likely to listen to you than a complete stranger. Pray and ask God to help you be more resolute in sharing the good news of Jesus this year!
